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BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

I. Objectives

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This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Bosnia and Herzegovina perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- Overall Context
- Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group
- World Bank Group's Work and Engagement on the Ground
- World Bank Group's Support in Development Areas
- World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities
- The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Bosnia and Herzegovina
- Communication and Information Sharing
- Background Information

II. Methodology

From September to November 2020, 399 stakeholders of the WBG in Bosnia and Herzegovina were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) Institutions, entities, cantons; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/ contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; independent government institutions; the judiciary system; state-owned enterprises; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; the financial sector/private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community based organizations; trade unions; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the media, and other organizations.

A total of 191 stakeholders participated in the survey (48% response rate). Respondents filled out the questionnaire via the online survey platform Qualtrics, or they received the questionnaire via email.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.


As a rule, the results in this year's Country Survey are compared to the results of the previous cycle of the Country Survey. In FY'21, the sample differed significantly from the FY'17 one, so the year comparison for these two samples was not conducted as statistically unviable.



Area of Primary Specialization

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



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Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group



• **Impact of familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in Bosnia and Herzegovina's development; and significantly, moderately corelated with their ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and with the ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in Bosnia and Herzegovina.





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


Perceptions of Economic Opportunity



"Do you think that economic opportunity for citizens in Bosnia and Herzegovina is ... ?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

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
Perceptions of Improvement and Decline in Specific Areas



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
What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty










Achieving Development Results (Indicator Question)


Influence on Bosnia and Herzegovina's Development Agenda (Indicator Question)

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

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
- Collaboration: Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 6.7) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.6). Responses for individual indicator questions by exposure to the WBG can be found in Appendix D (page 70).
- Stakeholder groups: Respondents from the office of a minister had the highest mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions, whereas respondents from CSO had significantly lower mean ratings. 

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

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Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Collaboration²






Helping the Poorest

The WBG's Human Capital Investment





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


"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?" (1-"Strongly disagree", 10-"Strongly agree") ¹Indicator Question




Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work and Activities




Meeting Bosnia and Herzegovina's Knowledge Needs (Indicator Question)

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





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

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

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

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

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


"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)




WBG Interaction Frequency




