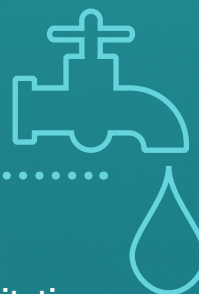

2. Adequate and well-functioning water, sanitation and hygiene services are available in health care facilities, schools, and priority public spaces.
3. Utilities are supported to provide continuous service.
4. Water services critical to household food security, such as irrigation, are maintained.
