#### 1.1 Development Objective

To increase equitable access for out-of-school children and improve literacy in focus states, and strengthen accountability for results, in basic education in Nigeria.

Current Development Objective (Approved as part of Additional Financing package Seq. 1 on 17-Dec-2021)

#### 3. KEY ISSUES & STATUS

#### 3.1 Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The Better Education Service Delivery for All - Additional Financing (BESDA-AF) Operation was approved by the Global Partnership for Education (GPE) Board in June 2021 and became effective in May 2022. GPE's US\$123.8 million financing will support the implementation of the government's Universal Basic Education (UBE) program in the three selected states of Nigeria: Oyo, Adamawa, and Katsina (OAK). The Federal Ministry of Education (FME) and the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC), together with the State Ministries of Education (SME) and the State Universal Basic Education Boards (SUBEBs) in the OAK states, are implementing the BESDA-AF Operation. It seeks to expand the scope of the previous, parent BESDA Operation (2017–2022) to address infrastructure constraints, weak teaching and learning

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practices, inefficient teacher deployment, and inadequate transparency in education spending in the OAK states, in line with the objectives of Nigeria's UBE program. The BESDA-AF Operation Program consists of Program-for-Results (PforR) and Investment Project Financing (IPF) components.

While a Mid-Term Review (MTR) mission is still ongoing, this Interim Implementation Status and Results Report (ISR) provides a brief summary of the progress of the BESDA-AF Operation toward achieving its Program Development Objective (PDO). A full ISR will be produced upon completion of the MTR mission in February 2025. Under Results Area (RA) 1 (Reduction in the number of the out-of-school children) of the PforR component, after the selection of underserved schools for the first round of school improvement grants (SIGs), 278 School Based Management Committees (SBMCs) received training on the preparation of school improvement plans. With the disbursement of SIGs of N3.5 billion, the SBMCs proceeded with renovation and construction of classroom and other school facilities to improve school infrastructure, which is close to completion. Following the school selection for the second (and final) round of SIGs and completion of training for 272 SBMCs, plans are underway for disbursement to the selected schools to commence construction and renovation. Under RA2 (Improvement of literacy rates), a total of 46,000 teachers have been selected for the Structured Pedagogy Program (SSP) and 4,653 school support officers (SSOs) have been identified to provide coaching and mentorship to teachers. However, due to the delay in completing the preparatory work for the SPP under the Investment Project Financing (IPF) component, the SPP activities under the PforR component have made minimal progress. Under RA 3(Strengthening accountability for results), a teacher deployment and redeployment policy was developed and approved by the Executive Governors of the OAK states. Transparency of basic education spending has increased with the publication of state-level education budget and expenditure accounts for the calendar year 2021. The deployment of newly recruited teachers to rural schools and urban schools with high pupil-teacher ratios has also been initiated in the OAK states.

**Under the IPF component**, a series of activities laid the groundwork for the SPP, including (i) developing student assessment items, teacher training modules, lesson plans, and teacher guides; (ii) conducting training for SSOs selected by each state to serve as master trainers for subsequent cascaded training; and (iii) procuring an EdTech firm to develop a digital platform for implementing the SPP. To date, a total of 160 SSO master trainers from Oyo and Adamawa States have been trained. The subsequent cascaded training of SSOs has also been completed in Oyo and is currently underway in Adamawa. Content development for the SSP, including teaching modules and guides for teachers, has been completed and its curation in digital format is currently underway in coordination with an EdTech firm contracted to develop a portal to facilitate the digitized SSP using tablets to be distributed to 60,000 teachers. However, due to supply chain issues and shipping delays, the procurement of the 60,000 tablets has been significantly delayed (they did not arrive until mid-January 2025). To facilitate teacher familiarization with the SPP prior to the distribution of tablets loaded with digitized content, the printing of a printed set of teacher modules and guides aligned with the electronic content is underway, followed by SPP training for master teacher trainers who will cascade the training in each of the OAK states. In addition, in order to expedite the verification of results for Years 2, 3, and 4 before the Program closes in October 2025, the procurement of an independent verification agent (who will conduct verifications on a rolling basis) is underway and is expected to be completed by April 30, 2025.
