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4. KEY ISSUES & STATUS

4.1 Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The Skills Development for Youth Employability Project underwent a second restructuring in February 2024, which included: (a) a partial cancellation of funds; (b) adjustments to the project scope and the results framework; and (c) an extension of the project's closing date from October 31, 2024 to July 31, 2025 to complete the reforms planned under Component 1.

Progress by Component

Component 1: Expanding Access to Skills through Improved Technical and Vocational Education. Despite delays in the recruitment of trainers and centre managers and the risk of late delivery of teaching equipment, progress is being made in this Component. Progress to date includes: (a) Construction of the new Sarh CFPT: The average rate of physical progress of all works is currently 72.6 percent percent, with 85 percent of the time already used, (b) a list of 133 training of trainers and managers to be trained abroad has been approved, a contract with a training firm was yet to be signed before the decision of the new minister in charge of vocational training to relocate the training in Chad; (c) the procurement process to purchase equipment for the existing centres and the Sarh centre has started with delivery scheduled for February 2025; and (d) the rehabilitation of the 2 LETINs in Moundou and N'Djaména should be completed by the end of January 2025.

Component 2: Employment Support for Youth and Improved Entrepreneurship Opportunities. The component is progressing satisfactorily. The project targets have been met, with (a) 10,400 young people enrolled in the three programs implemented: apprenticeships, work placements and training for young agricultural producers, (b) 3,000 young people, 44 per cent of whom are girls, have been placed in jobs in N'Djamena and 20 other provinces, (c) 3,183 young people, including 1,273 girls (40 percent), received practical training under the supervision of 1,216 master craftsmen (MA) in 291 companies in 16 sectors, (d) 4,200 young farmers, 45 percent of them girls, were trained in agricultural entrepreneurship in the provinces of Moyen-Chari and Salamat with the support of NGOs recruited by the project.

Component 3: Improving TVET System Governance and Institutional Capacity Building. The main activities carried out under this component concern the revision of the legal framework for the TVET. Seven (7) texts have been prepared. These texts include (i) a law establishing a framework for technical and vocational education and training; (ii) a tripartite framework partnership agreement for the development of technical and vocational education and training; (iii) three decrees dealing respectively with the national framework for vocational certification in Chad, the general status of public technical and vocational education and training institutions, and the organisation of apprenticeship and the procedures for its operation. In anticipation of the publication of these projects in the near future, it is proposed that provisional works councils be set up at Sarh and in the 3 CFPTs.

Component 4: Project Management and Monitoring and Evaluation. A total of 758 young people are registered in ONAPE's online job and internship search system, and several private companies have posted job and internship opportunities. Ten (10) regular monitoring missions of the Sarh construction site were carried out by the project implementation unit and the Ministry in charge of vocational training, as well as 4 missions were carried out by the

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environmental expert. These missions, along with close monitoring by the task team, have accelerated the implementation of the CFPT construction in Sarh.

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
