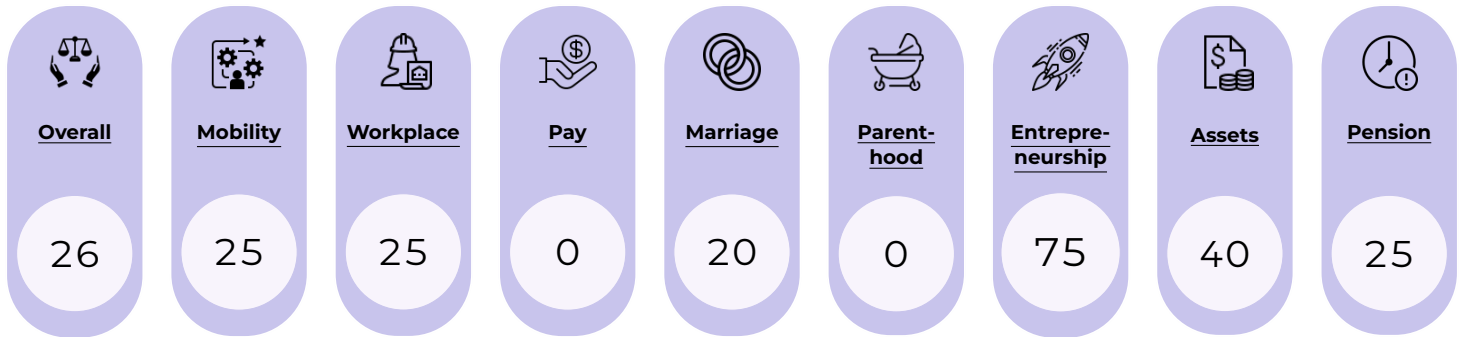

Women, Business and the Law in West Bank and Gaza

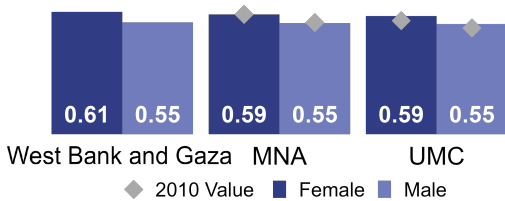
Women, Business and the Law (WBL) 2023 presents an index covering 190 economies, structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across eight indicators. **West Bank and Gaza scores 26 out of 100**, while the regional average across Middle East and North Africa is 55.



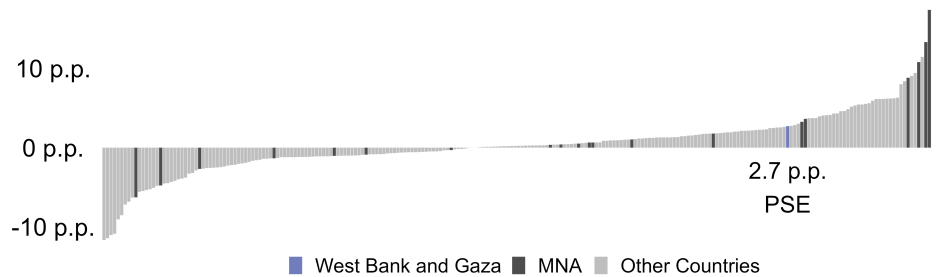
A Closer Look at Gender Equality in West Bank and Gaza

Despite some progress, gender gaps, gender-based violence, and disadvantageous social norms facing women and girls persist, and gains in human capital of women and girls remain untapped. Turning human capital investments into economic gains means addressing multiple barriers to women's economic empowerment, including improving their voice and agency.
