

EGYPT, ARAB REP. GENDER LANDSCAPE

Women, Business and the Law in Egypt, Arab Rep. **Women, Business and the Law (WBL) 2023** presents an index covering 190 economies, structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across eight indicators. **Egypt, Arab Rep. scores 51 out of 100,** while the regional average across Middle East and North Africa is 55.




A Closer Look at Gender Equality in Egypt, Arab Rep.

Despite some progress, gender gaps, gender-based violence, and disadvantageous social norms facing women and girls persist, and gains in human capital of women and girls remain untapped. Turning human capital investments into economic gains means addressing multiple barriers to women's economic empowerment, including improving their voice and agency.
