


# **FOPULATION BY AGE AND POVERTY STATUS, 2011 (MILLIONS)**






POVERTY HEADCOUNT RATIO, 2005-2011




## **INEQUALITY INDICES, 2005-2011**




# INCOME/CONSUMPTION GROWTH PER CAPITA BY QUINTILE, 2006-2011

National poverty estimates in Montenegro are produced by the Statistical Office of Montenegro (MONSTAT) based on the annual Household Budget Survey (HBS). The methodology for poverty estimation is based on an absolute poverty line, estimated at 182.43 Euros per equivalent adult per month in 2012. In 2012, the most recent year of published figures, 11.3% of the population lived in poverty.\* The most recent national strategy for statistical development in Montenegro is the Programme of Statistical Surveys 2009-2013, oriented to improve the quality of the surveys. The most recent HBS available for Montenegro in the World Bank's regional internal microdata catalog, the ECA Data Portal, is for the year 2011.
