ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The Government of Nepal (GoN) through the Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock (MoALD) is currently developing the Rural Economic and Enterprise Development Project (REEDP) in four economic corridors, which will encompass five provinces (Province 1, 2, 3, 5 and 7). The Project aims to enhance rural entrepreneurship and strengthen the market linkages of rural entrepreneurs, including smallholder farmers and producers. The project is being considered for World Bank funding through Investment Project Financing.
- 2. The Government of Nepal, through MOALD will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the World Bank Environmental and Social Standards (*ESSs*). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (*ESCP*) sets out a summary of the material measures and actions.
- 3. Where the ESCP refers to specific plans or other documents, whether they have already been prepared or are to be developed, the ESCP requires compliance with all provisions of such plans or other documents. In particular, the ESCP requires compliance with the provisions set out in the Environment and Social Management Framework (ESMF), The Resettlement Policy Framework (RPF), Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP) and Indigenous People Policy Framework (IPPF). The Project Organizational Manual (POM) will outline the details of how the Project will comply with the instruments detailed above throughout implementation.
- 4. The table below summarizes the material measures and actions that are required as well as the timing of the material measures and actions. The Government of Nepal is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the MoALD.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Bank by the Government of Nepal as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Bank will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the Bank and the Government of Nepal, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Government of Nepal will agree to the changes with the Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the Government of Nepal. The Government of Nepal will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the Government of Nepal shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts, which may include: negative environmental and social impacts related to land degradation in areas subjected to intensified production and new clearings; generalized long term pollution from possible increased use of pesticides and agrochemicals; loss of natural habitat and biodiversity, and disturbance of wildlife due to expansion of agricultural clearings/pasture and opening of new roads; loss of family home gardens among smallholder farmers due to cultivation of Production Partnership-supported cash crop, aggravating the nutrition problem; involuntary loss of assets due to land acquisition; failure to respect the

rights of indigenous people and exclusion from benefits of ethnic minorities and Dalits; possible impacts on cultural heritage sites, monuments and structures; and institutional risks – inadequate capacity of MoALD on ESS application
